A Note from JENKS...

Recently, we attended Youth camp at Caswell. I can honestly say this week of the year is a highlight of my year. Being in the company of 1,000 teens is not for everybody, but when you add the presence of God, it is an experience like no other. This year was especially touching and emotional for me. My oldest daughter, Lexi got to attend as a camper. A definite sign of her growing up before my eyes and her dad aging. I have very fond memories of each year and every Youth I have had the privilege to take to Caswell. One day I plan on writing a letter to each Youth thanking them for the opportunity and honor of sharing in such an amazing week of their lives. I knew going into this week our students as well as leaders would be challenged in many ways.

Our speaker for the week is a very knowledgeable and educated man in the scriptures. We have heard him before a couple years earlier. One morning during our large group bible study, my mind drifted to another passage of scripture and got me thinking about our youth, our church and our community. I wrote several passages down along with some notes but it didn't come together until my family went to the movies. We went to see the new/old movie "The Lion King". I have to admit that I have never seen the original from start to finish. I always would catch bits and pieces of it over the years. By never watching the original in full, I had no inclination to compare the two versions. I must say after viewing the new version I will try and find the time to view the original someday.

Sometime during the middle of the movie, my mind drifted back to the notes I had jotted down in my workbook at Caswell, along with the scriptures I wrote down. I couldn't stop thinking of a little book of the Bible not many people turn to or even really look to read. This book was Jude. Just a small Book before the end of the New Testament. With only 25 verses, most have never given it much attention or have overlooked it.

I found myself thinking more and more of Jude's intentions and concerns and I find that he could be talking to the characters of the Lion King. As the movie progresses Simba feels he is responsible for the death of his dad, Mufasa. As he runs away from it all he starts going through life with the motto, *Hakuna Matata* (No Worries). During a pivotal scene, Simba doubts his place and even if he is worthy of being the Son the King. He has allowed the worldly way of thinking affect his actions and even his self-worth and identity. It's only when he is taken to a body of water that he realizes that he is a reflection of his Father. As it is with us, it's only when we are diving into God's word, studying and applying it to our lives that we see our reflection of our Father in us. Jude's words of encouragement offer us an insight to stand firm in our faith and our rightful place within the kingdom. They also warn us to be watchful and diligent in our day to day lives that we don't let the world around us define us or gets us to forget who we should obey. I would like to encourage you to find time to read the Book of Jude and look for ways we as believers can reach out to others the way the LORD has reached out to us.
