Dear Family of God of Philadelphia,

One of the advantages of being the pastor of a church that is more than 245 years old, is that I know that we have survived much worse than this virus. Over the past couple of weeks when I have been struggling with and learning how to pastor a church that can't meet, I spent some time looking at our church history.

Although we don't know a great deal about our first few years of ministry, we do know that they met under a brush arbor throughout the Revolutionary War. In 1797, land was given to the church, and sometime after George Washington's second inauguration they made plans for an actual building to be built. I can only imagine how difficult it was to maintain a congregation in those early years when our nation was in turmoil and transition. But the church survived.

Sometime between 1835 and 1840, the church became divided over missions and other doctrinal issues. The church had two pastors during this time. One group, the Missionary Baptist, met in the church building part of the time. The other group, the Anti-missionary Baptist met at a different time. The pastor of the Anti-missionary group eventually moved west, and the church was united again. In spite of these disagreements, the church survived.

Around 1850, the church built a new building. It was also around that time that the church named changed its name from Lanes Creek Church to Philadelphia Baptist Church. The name Philadelphia means brotherly love, and it was that love that helped them survive the most brutal part of our nation's history. During the Civil War brothers fought against brothers, and more than 2% of the America population died. But the church survived.

In the early part of 1948 just after the second great war, youth and children were not permitted to attend public church services because of the Polio Ban. So, the church postponed their revival services until September so they could attend. After this revival the church voted to enlarge the pulpit area "to have room for youth programs and special singings." By the way, that year they also increased their budget from \$2,500 to \$3,950. The church not only survived but thrived that year.

Our church will survive this virus, and we will come out stronger on the other side. It is my prayer that those who come behind us will find that we were faithful during our time.

May our Father bless you today. It is a joy to serve our Lord with you. RCA

ANNIE ARMSTRONG BY NATIONAL WMU ON AUGUST 22, 2018



Annie Walker Armstrong was the first corresponding secretary (executive director) of Woman's Missionary Union. She was born on July 11, 1850, in Baltimore, Maryland. Her family was very active in Baptist life. Annie went with her mother to the missionary meetings of Woman's Mission to Woman. There she developed a heart for missions. Annie helped plant churches, served those who lived in poverty and addiction, and organized other women to help her reach out to African Americans, Native Americans, and impoverished people in rural areas. In 1882, Annie helped organize the Woman's Baptist Home Mission Society of Maryland. She was the first president of the society.

During this time, women around the United States were developing missional lives. On May 14, 1888, women from 12 states met in Richmond, Virginia. They formed the Executive Committee of Woman's Mission Societies, Auxiliary to the Southern Baptist Convention. In 1888, Annie Armstrong was elected corresponding secretary. Today that position is known as executive director. In 1890 the group became Woman's Missionary Union. Annie Armstrong served WMU until 1906. She did not accept a salary for her work. In 1934 the offering for the Home Mission Board was renamed the Annie Armstrong Easter Offering for Home Missions. Annie Armstrong died on December 20, 1938. Woman's Missionary Union was 50 years old.

IMPORTANT EVENTS THAT HAPPENED WHILE ANNIE ARMSTRONG WAS DIRECTOR OF WMU:

- 1888 The motto, "Go Forward" was chosen.
 - o Foreign missions offering established to send a missionary to China to relieve Lottie Moon.
- **1890** The organization was officially named Woman's Missionary Union, Auxiliary to the Southern Baptist Convention.
 - WMU agreed to raise enough money to support all women foreign missionaries.
- 1892 First week of prayer held in connection with the Christmas Offering.
- **1894** WMU began promoting work of the Sunday School Board. Extra offering taken to pay Foreign Mission Board debt. The offering went over its goal.
- 1895 First week of prayer and offering to pay off Home Mission Board Debt was established.
- 1896 WMU adopted Sunbeam work at the request of the Foreign Mission Board.
- **1899** WMU recommended that churches use a system of organizations for missionary education. Baby Bands was the first group organized.
- 1900 WMU set up and funded the Home Mission's Board Church Building Loan Fund.
 - WMU opened the Margaret Home for children of missionaries who were overseas.
 - First WMU-sponsored church-wide event a stewardship emphasis.
- 1906 WMU began the process of legal incorporation.
 - WMU adopted a week of prayer for state missions.
 - WMU began publishing literature for sale. Our Mission Fields is the magazine published by WMU.

How do I register for Text2Give?

Registration requires the use of a browser, either on your phone or other internet-enabled device. In both cases, you will need to have access to your cell phone. To use your phone to register, text REGISTER to (704) 703-2525. We will respond by text with a link you can use to register using your phone's browser. To use a browser on a device other than your phone use this address:

You will receive confirmation by text and email that your registration was successfully completed. We recommend saving (704) 703-2525 to your contacts for easy reference.

How do I give a donation using Text2Give? Once you have registered, simply text an amount up to \$2,000.00 (e.g. "\$75" or "27.50") to

(704) 703-2525. You will receive confirmation by text and email that your request has been accepted. Your account will be charged/debited in two business days.

Can I direct my donation to a particular fund or funds?

You will receive a link in your donation confirmation which will allow you to designate all or a portion of your donation to a particular fund or campaign of your choosing.

How can I update my registration?

Text UPDATE to (704) 703-2525. We will text you a link in response. To use a browser on a device other than your phone, use this


How can I request the cancellation of a transaction or have all or part of a donation refunded?






