Dear Family of God of Philadelphia,

This week, I was speaking with someone who is going through an especially difficult time in their life. The truth is I spoke with several people this week who are struggling with a "new normal" and trying to hold on to their faith in the process.

When my granddaughter died, I found myself in a similar place. A dear friend of mine loaned me a book that helped me to hang on. The book is entitled, "*Tracks of a Fellow Struggler*" and was written by a pastor named John Claypool.

In one of the chapters, he describes himself as "a burdened and broken brother, limping back into the family circle to tell you something of what I learned out there in the darkness."

He suggests that one of the mistakes that Adam and Eve made in the Garden of Eden was that instead of enjoying the banquet table of creation that was set them, they wanted to know all the answers that were God's alone to know. So, they are from the forbidden tree hoping to take a shortcut to knowledge that God wanted them to get through and by life's experiences.

Let me again quote from Claypool's book: "We do not first get all the answers and then live in the light of our understanding. We must rather plunge into life—meeting what we have to meet and experiencing what we have to experience—and in the light of living try to understand. If insight comes at all, it will not be before, but only through and after experience."

James put it this way in James 1:2–4: "My brethren, count it all joy when you fall into various trials, knowing that the testing of your faith produces patience. But let patience have its perfect work, that you may be perfect and complete, lacking nothing." While none of us enjoy our trials, if we allow Him, God will use our trials to mold us and shape us more into the image of His Son.

May our Father bless you today. It is a joy to serve our Lord with you.

A Note from Jenks...

As most of you know, I am a part-time employee at Lowes and working full-time at Piedmont High School. It wasn't as if I woke up one day and said "you know, I think I'll go part-time and see where that takes me". I didn't go out looking for another job. It found me. I was approached for the position I am in now by several Administrators at the High School. Honestly, it has gone a lot better than I thought it would. I'll admit there have been moments that I have questioned my decision.

Part of my duties in my new role at Piedmont High School involves assigning buses for all the athletic teams and various field trips within the Piedmont High cluster of schools. Currently, I am working on the spring sports team's schedules. We have around 9 or 10 different sports that students can participate in. Most of the time, the teams hardly ever play on the road at the same time, but there are days when we have 5 or 6 sports traveling on the same day, making it difficult to accommodate each sport.

A Note from Jenks...(continued)

One of the most well-known team motto or slogan is "WE ARE". This line or motto was made famous by Marshall University. It was a unifying call to come together during a devastating time in the school's history. The events of that time were made into a very good movie by the same title "WE ARE MARSHALL". If you have time check it out. It is a very good movie.

I'm sure there are many, many more than most of you that are reading this can associate with. There are even a few I can't put in this writing.

As I was looking over each sport and their own motto, I couldn't help but to think of a passage in Mark's Gospel. In the 12th chapter, Mark tells us a story of the widow's offering. I have been familiar with this passage for many years and have heard many speakers, teachers and preachers use it to teach many different points. In that passage, there are a few words that stand out to me more so than ever before. Mark tells us Jesus sat down opposite of the treasury and saw HOW the people put their offering in.

Have you ever thought about that? How exactly do people put their offering in? It specifically says, depending on the version or translation you have, that Jesus watched HOW people put it in. What does that look like? Is it merely placing your offering in with care or tossing it in as if it isn't important? Is it a theatrical show? Is it like Michael Jordan soaring through the air to slam-dunk it in.

The very fact that Mark tells us Jesus watched How they put their offering in leads me to believe it could have been all of the above and more.

As Jesus and the disciples are sitting there, this widow came and gave a small insignificant offering to most but Jesus calls out the offering as much more than that.

In my mind, this widow's slogan or motto could have been several of the mottos mentioned earlier.

Jesus says the others gave out of their abundance but she gave ALL SHE HAD. You could say she had a "Refuse to Lose" mindset. Her "Attitude was Everything". She had "Whatever is Necessary" belief. I tend to think she lived out the "All it takes is all you Got" lifestyle.

For you and I, through Jesus' birth, Life, Death and Resurrection we can be victorious because "Victory Requires Payment in Advance". Jesus did that for ALL. In doing so, we believers can be a better TEAM because Together Everyone Achieves More. As Christians, we should also cast a light and be a witness for others to see a "Who's Next?" approach to not only our life but also as a church.

Truth be told,

Jesus had his own slogan or Motto...

TO SEEK and TO SAVE that which was LOST.
