Appalachian Coalfields Ministry Backpack List BACK PACKS DUE BY WEDNESDAY, NOVEMBER 4th

- **A)** Small items of **NEW items of warm clothing** such as winter hats, gloves, socks, scarves, etc.
- **B)** Small **pop-top canned food** such as ravioli, tuna, beef stew, vegetables, fruit (3-4 cans)
- **C)** At least 1-2 **NEW**, age appropriate non-breakable toy (*no toy weapons, please!*) This can include small cars, balls, dolls, small stuffed animals, yo-yos, jump rope, sidewalk chalk, card games, Legos, etc. For oldest age group (15-17) substitute an appropriate item instead of a toy, such as, a flashlight, small thermos, light blanket, books, hunting and fishing magazines for the boys jewelry, books, skin care products, hair accessories, etc. for girls.
- **D) Hygiene items** including full sized containers of toothpaste, body wash, shampoo, and deodorant, as well as toothbrush, soap, washcloth, brush or comb. (*Please fit these items into a one-gallon Ziploc bag so they do not leak out into the rest of the backpack*).
- E) Fresh, wrapped candy (no chocolate or peanut products)
- **F)** A children's **Bible** or youth Bible (*no one version is required*) Please make sure that every pack has a Bible in it!

Age Grouping and Labeling. Each backpack should be labeled boy or girl as well as the appropriate age using 10" ribbons.

Age groupings for this year are 4-7, 8-10, 11-14, 15-17.

Blue ribbon will indicate a boy's backpack. Pink ribbon will indicate a girl's backpack.

Luke 23:44-56

Jesus Dies on the Cross

⁴⁴ Now it ^[a]was about the sixth hour, and there was darkness over all the earth until the ninth hour. ⁴⁵ Then the sun was ^[b]darkened, and the veil of the temple was torn in ^[c]two. ⁴⁶ And when Jesus had cried out with a loud voice, He said, "Father, 'into Your hands I commit My spirit.'"
