Dear Family of God of Philadelphia,

During this past Sunday's sermon, I mentioned that I believe that this year's Vacation Bible School may be the most important one we have ever had, at least during my tenure as your pastor. While the pandemic has taken many lives and has even left many survivors will lasting medical problems, one of the most devastating impacts of this tragedy has been the impact it has had upon our children.

For more than a year, they have had their school schedules obliterated; they had not had enough interaction with their extended family, particularly their grandparents; they have not been physically touched (hugged, patted on the back, etc.), something children desperately need; they have been forced to spend too much time in front of the computer, rather than enjoying outside activities; and many of them have missed any Biblical instruction at all, a task that is the responsibility of the parents, but many times is achieved only by attending the local church. While the typical 40-year-old adult has seen this as a disruption to 3% of their lives so far, the average 7-year-old has seen this disruption for 15% of their lives. This is time, educational opportunities, extended family interactions, and Biblical instruction they cannot get back without intentional efforts.

The result these disruptions have been devastating for children. Hospital and mental health professionals tell me that every available mental health bed in our hospitals is full most of the time. The average age of patients in those beds has dropped significantly. Children as young as 6 or 7 years old are having suicidal thoughts and are having to receive very specialized help just to survive. This breaks my heart more than I can describe.

So, how can we help? What can we do as a church family to make the situation better? We need workers who are gifted to teach children to find a place of service in our weekly ministries (Sunday School, Nursery, Children's Church, RA's, GA's, Mission Friends, etc.) We need more workers to commit to helping in Vacation Bible School. Whether you help in the kitchen, help with crafts, teach in a class, help with music, or just help with security, we need you. Even if you can only commit to one night, we need you. Let's make this the best Vacation Bible School ever! We need people to pray specifically for our children. When you are here on Sunday, we need you to smile at our children and encourage them. This may seem small, but it is very important especially at this moment in time. Thank you in advance for what you are going to do.

May our Father bless you today. It is a joy to serve our Lord with you! RCA

A NOTE FROM JENKS...

Years ago, when I was an assistant basketball coach, we wanted to make the season as memorable as we could. Our coach wanted to give the kids a chance to see other parts of the country. Since he was from Ohio, he thought, "let's take these guys on a real road trip." So, we did. We made plans to go up to Ohio and play in a holiday tournament. We were going to make it a small weekend trip. Many of these players had never been outside the Carolinas. To be honest, some of the games we played in football and basketball was the furthest they had ventured out past their community.

We set out on a big blue activity bus from Chesterfield County. One of our players didn't go on the trip because his dad didn't think it was a good idea. His dad said "Ain't no way that bus will make it up in the cold weather and I've seen Coach drive. It's bad enough allowing his son to ride to our away games."

We all laughed at his remarks, even though I knew he was right on one of them. Coach couldn't drive without looking at all the passengers. I am a firm believer in eye contact when you are talking to someone, but I draw the line when one is driving and trying to make eye contact with those in seats behind him.

We soon found out the other statement was true as well. Turns out, Ole blue wasn't used to cold weather, and we broke down about a mile from the hotel we were staying. We scrambled around and got to the hotel. It took a day to get the bus working, and even then, we had to leave it running all night.

As we toured the city, I noticed all the guys looking at all the surroundings with jaws wide open. They were in awe of all the things they saw. At one point I told several of the guys that they could close their mouths, this was nothing compared to towns around us back home. That city has a population of roughly 25,000 people. That City was Athens, Ohio.

It just so happens that I have been reading, studying and reflecting on another city by the same name in the Bible.

In Acts 17, Paul is on his second missionary trip. Paul has made his way through Thessalonica and Berea and now finds himself in Athens. A city that had roughly 250,000 people. Even though it had been a wealthy and full of culture as the center of Greek Empire it was now under the rule of the Roman Empire. It was still a very influential and cultural city, even though it had lost some of its power.

A verse I want to focus on is ACTS 17:16

¹⁶ Now while Paul waited for them at Athens, his spirit was provoked within him when he saw that the city was ^[a]given over to idols.

It says his spirit was PROVOKED within him because the city was full of idols and things the people tried to make into a god. As Paul was walking around, he saw all the altars and temples to all these gods they made and even found one they labeled the UNKNOWN GOD. The people there wanted to have another one just in case their god couldn't give them what they wanted or meet their needs.


