It is past time for us to revive this. This is an open invitation for all our men to spend some time together: sharing “guy stories”, laughing together, and challenging each other to be better men. Please make plans to come. Bring your sons and grandsons. Bring another guy friend who needs to be around godly men. It is going to be a great time. On September 17th from 10:30 a.m. – 11:00 a.m., in downtown Monroe, our Union Baptist Association is sponsoring a “Prayer Walk for Righteousness.” This walk is available to everyone, but it is imperative that we have men to show up to protect us from those who may be there to oppose us. This walk is in response to the Pride Festival that will be held at Belk Tonawanda Park on September 18th. Muffin Tin Pumpkin Pie (Rada Cutlery Recipe)

This easy to make homemade pumpkin pie recipe offers everyone's favorite holiday dessert with a fabulous twist! These delightful, bite-sized, individual pumpkin pies will have everyone thankful to be together! Course: Dessert; Servings: 12

Ingredients

- 2 9-inch pie crusts, store bought or homemade
- 2 large eggs
- 1 (15 oz.) can pumpkin
- 3/4 cup sugar
- 1 3/4 teaspoon pumpkin pie spice
- 1/2 teaspoon salt
- 1 (12 oz.) can evaporated milk
- Whipped cream
- Round cookie cutter or bowl 4" in diameter
- Muffin tin

Instructions

1. Preheat oven to 425 degrees. Roll out pie crust dough. Using a cookie cutter or 4" bowl, cut 12 circles from pie crust dough.
2. Spray each muffin tin with cooking spray. Place each pie dough circle into a muffin tin.
3. In a mixing bowl, beat 2 large eggs.
4. Add 15 ounce can pumpkin to eggs and 3/4 cup sugar.
5. Add 1 3/4 teaspoon pumpkin pie spice. Add 1/2 teaspoon salt.
6. Stir mix thoroughly.
7. Gradually add 12 ounce can evaporated milk until well blended.
8. Score pie dough with fork to prevent heaving.
9. Fill individual tins with pumpkin mix. Place in 425° oven for 15 minutes. Reduce heat to 350 and bake for 25 to 30 minutes.
10. Remove from oven and allow to cool. Add whipped topping as desired. Enjoy!
