
### Easter Egg Hunt & Lunch Saturday, April 12<sup>th</sup>



What a crazy month we are having! When Sarah and I talked about a club visit to her church in Stony Point, it was a sunny day with temperatures in the 70's. When we traveled to see her, it was raining in the 30s. A week later, it was snowing. I thank you so much for your partnerships through all kinds of weather. Club visits would not be possible without you.

Sarah Robertson is the Awana Ministry Director for Stony Point Baptist Church. We were invited to visit their Awana club last month. She told me their pastor had resigned, and they didn't have a youth director. Their sanctuary was old and found to be structurally unsafe, and they had just moved into their fellowship hall. But they love Awana, and Awana is still going strong. I watched the Cubbies (3 & 4-year-olds) as they presented their valentines to the senior ladies in the church. They sang sweet songs, and most of the ladies sang along with them. I spoke with the game director, Ms. Lindy, who said their game space has been reduced since the church had to move to the fellowship hall. We talked about games she could do in small spaces. I visited with the Sparky's (Kindergarten through 2 grade) and the T&T club (3rd through 6th graders). I noticed loving, caring adults pouring their hearts into the children, helping them to belong. They didn't have a huge group of children, but the leaders made those children feel special.

I look forward to seeing God's hand as he grows their church.
