

## Monday, May 26<sup>th</sup>

Dear Philadelphia Baptist Church,

Thank you so much for your prayers and gifts to my ministry. I appreciate all you do to reach children with the Gospel of Christ. Sometimes, things happen that are beyond our control. During this time, we decide whether to continue discipling the children entrusted to our care or do we give up and wait until the following year to start over. When Robert faced this decision in the face of a challenge, he did not give up. Instead, he continued his Awana ministry from his truck.

The Awana Ministry Director at Waxhaw Bible Church, Robert Wildermuth, faced a big dilemma last year. In previous years, the Awana club used three buildings for eight classrooms, storage space, offices, and meeting rooms. Removal of the three buildings occurred during the summer. Robert had seen the Awana videos highlighting how second and third-world countries hold Awana Clubs with little more than a dirt patch and a nearby shelter. Robert was encouraged to run Waxhaw Bible Church's Awana club in a 50-foot-by-100-foot room. Through it all, God is providing!

The Cubbies moved to the nursery. With a couple of tables, the lobby became the office for the secretaries. Robert and his team taped down another game square so the Sparks and T&T clubbers could run games simultaneously. When the Sparks and T&T clubbers completed their games, the youth strategically moved the partitions, tables, and carts of surplus chairs to form six classrooms from the two game squares for Small Group Time. Another shift of the tables, and they held Large Group in the same space. Children went to the stage for songs and interaction time during the transition. The youth also helped by listening to verses and assisting during game time. After Awana, the teens are dismissed and participate in their Bible Study.

Oh, and ministry out of his truck? Throughout the entire Awana year, the back of Robert's pickup served as the storage supply area. The youth also assisted in unloading and reloading the truck every Awana Club night. The benefit was for the teens who could **Become** while living out their faith and seeing God in action.

Thank you for your continued commitment to supporting our ministry. Your prayers and financial gifts of \$150.00 per month enable us to witness youth reaching their full potential and **Becoming** true, resilient disciples of God. #### Mother's Day Offering Frequently Asked Questions

#### Week of Prayer: May 4<sup>th</sup> – 10<sup>th</sup> Ingathering: Sunday, May 11<sup>th</sup>

How is the Offering used? Every dollar of every gift helps patients pay medical bills at Atrium Health Wake Forest Baptist. They are a very special group of patients. The Offering helps patients who "fall between the cracks" of assistance. They have a little too much to qualify for government help or the Hospital's charity care program. However, they do not have enough to pay medical bills they are responsible for. With nowhere to turn for help, they receive a letter from the Hospital that says, "Your medical bill has been paid by compassionate and mission-minded North Carolina Baptists in the name of Jesus Christ and His love."

How are patients referred for assistance? Hospital financial counselors make most of the referrals. They look for deserving patients who are painfully in need – those who are burdened by medical bills, trying to help themselves, but in need of a helping hand. They carefully screen every referral, taking detailed financial statements to verify needs and rule out any other possible means of assistance. Ministers or others also call Church and Community Relations to refer people whom they know are struggling with their hospital bills.

How are decisions made about providing help? The Baptist Benevolent Committee (six N.C. Baptist ministers and laypersons) receives the referrals and prayerfully evaluates how much assistance to provide. The amount usually averages from a few hundred to a few thousand dollars per patient.

What is the impact? A recent recipient of the Mother's Day Offering wrote to say, "I am sending heartfelt gratitude from myself and my son for the payment of the balance of his medical bill ... This generous gift was an answer to prayer and a great blessing at this time." Another recipient spoke for many when he said, "My faith was growing weak and I thought that God had forgotten all about me. The Mother's Day Offering strengthened my faith and let me know there was hope, that God was with us." And another said, "The Mother's Day Offering saved us and changed our lives. What a powerful way to tell others about the love of Jesus."






Thank God for Mother's Love
