A Note from Jenks...

Well, June is now upon us. Just wanted to say thanks for all the prayers and support we received during the Fish Fry. What a day it was. I am so thankful for everyone that took part in making it happen. I love the fellowship, even though I am stuck in a small room by myself most of the time. I can say I literally prayed over every pound of fish, close to 700 Lbs. Most of those prayers were selfish I admit. I prayed my back would hold up for the days after. It was a 17-hour day for me followed by an all-day regional track meet for the High School. By the way, both days were a huge success, but my body suffered the next day or two. :) Leading up to the Fish Fry, I had planned, prepped and prayed for that day to be a rewarding experience for all. Things got hectic several days before the event. Our supplier called to say that there was a slight issue with our order. Slight issue? It was more like a major problem. The flounder that we normally get was packaged wrong and they decided to send it all back instead of going through it and repackaging it. Really? Did I mention this all happened on a Monday, three days before the Fish Fry. Kind of hard to have a Fish Fry without Fish. Now what? He assured me they had a different brand comparable to what we normally get. I told him we wouldn't waver on the flounder, and I had no time to try another flounder or another brand. Yes, I could probably use it, and it would be good, but it wouldn't be the same. Yes, I probably could have made more \$\$ using that brand but it is more than that. It is a standard that we have set. Many people may not come back the next time if we substitute our calling card, the flounder. I spent time and \$\$ on trying to contact other businesses that afternoon. I must have called or visited 5-7 places looking for anyone


that might have what we use. Finally, I reached out to a smaller distributor that was more of a specialty group. The guy I spoke to was awesome. I had called 5 minutes before they closed for the day. I explained my problem and that I needed the product ASAP. He said his normal route for our area was the next day but it was already loaded. He said he would call me first thing Tuesday morning with pictures to make sure this was what we wanted. I didn't sleep at all that night. So many thoughts went through my mind. Do we use a lesser fish? Do we cancel or postpone it? What do we do if this other product wasn't good? Will the faithful customers refuse to purchase a plate next year? I finally just said a prayer and let God handle the details. The next morning, I eagerly awaited a call from Thomas, my new best friend:) He sent me a text with pictures of what he had on hand. I hesitated before opening the picture text. Boom!! Thomas had hit it out of the park. It was exactly what we were after. I told him I would do whatever I needed to do to get it. I didn't even care about the cost; well...., I did but I was willing to take a hit this year to keep from cancelling or settling for a lesser product. He said come on up anytime and ask for him. I had planned on going up on Wednesday to pick it all up. Keep in mind it is 650+ lbs. of fish. Preacher Caroll asked what he could do to help. I told him I had to be there to shake Thomas' hand (and give him a hug). Preacher said it was no big deal. He would leave early get some lunch with Dianne and maybe see his mom. Another problem taken care of. Thanks Preacher Caroll, of course Dianne as well. :) It was after all, 650+ pounds of fish. Well, the rest is history. Another year, another fish fry success. Many different people helped make it special.

Now we transition into Summer. Some students will transition to a new school, some will transition to the work force, others will continue their schooling in various colleges and universities.

We, as a congregation at PBC, will transition into new leadership. No matter how much we prepare, prep, plan, and even pray about something, things can still pop up and hinder our progress. The biggest thing we should do is understand that if God is in it, things will always work as long as we give him the glory. Many behind the scenes have prayed for the fish fry as soon as last years was over. We have prayed that God will get the glory and honor in the next one.
