## A Note from Jenks

### **"GET YOUR POPCORN READY"**

During one of the downtimes during our Live Nativity, I was sitting by the fire listening to all the chatter of the youth and adults. The crackling of the fire got me to thinking a little deeper. This phrase "Get your Popcorn ready" kept coming to my mind.

Terrell Owens, a talented NFL player coined this phrase when he signed a contract to play for the Dallas Cowboys. His reasoning was this was a great pairing and great things were to come.

It got me thinking about other times when I have used similar phrases when coaching a sport.

I have told several athletes over the years that not all popcorn pops at the same time. My point is/was that not everyone sees instant results or shows instant improvement. For some, it happens quickly, but if it doesn't happen for them right away, there is no need to get discouraged. Eventually everything will work out, as long as they keep striving to get better.

As I pondered these things more, it was time to act out the last scene of our Live nativity again.

We had done this scene a few times but each time, it took on a new meaning or gave me more insight on how this actually played out in real time during the life of Jesus and continues to this day.

My role in our scene is one of the soldiers leading Jesus to the cross. Of course, we were dressed as such and had spears as props. In our role, we mock Jesus, we ridicule, we hurled insult after insult at him. I drew the line at spitting at him. By the way, I just couldn't do that. The scene pales in comparison to the real life suffering he went through, but it still is an emotionally, physically, and mentally a tough thing to do over and over. Our cast in this scene did a fantastic job.

After each scene, I debriefed by thanking him for all he has done for us by saying a little prayer. In the scene, Jesus carries a smaller cross as we are leading him to the place between the other two crosses. We then raise him on a bigger one. As we were finishing the scene and going back behind the building, I usually try to pick that cross up along with any other props we use and go behind our area until the next group comes through. On several occasions I had a cross in one hand and the soldiers spear in the other. WOW!! What a real-life picture we all at some point will have to deal with. Two choices before us.

The Cross or the Spear. We all face this dilemma every day. Do we choose to crucify him all over by giving in to our sinful self or do we choose to place ourselves at the cross and trust and rely on the fact that Jesus did it all for us ?Do we pick up our cross daily and FOLLOW HIM? As we continued to act out the scene, those thoughts kept running through my mind. As I looked around and saw every age group represented throughout all of the nativity scenes, I was overcome with a sense of JOY. Seeing the different age groups come together to witness, proclaim, and preach the GOOD NEWS of Jesus warmed my heart more than the actual fires we had going. It was pretty cold Sunday night:). Then I thought of all the baptisms we have had over the last few months. All ages were represented in that as well. Proclaiming or preaching their first sermon for others to see the choice they made to follow Jesus. When I see the age differences, I go back to that statement that "not all popcorn kernels pop at the same time". We as Philadelphia Baptist Church call ourselves a Beacon of Hope (lighthouse) in the community. I believe we are doing just that. We are called to be Salt and Light to the world. We have the awesome responsibility but also a great privilege in that process. Which leads me to that NFL players statement, "Get Your Popcorn Ready." Much like all kernels don't pop at the same time, we are tasked with investing and pouring out our faith with those we come in contact with. We are called to get those young, and old kernels ready to serve the Lord. So, we can continue to be the Lighthouse for our Community. We have so many talented and great teachers here. Thank you for your dedication and service.

As we are transitioning into a New Year, a New Pastor and his Family, a New Chapter, if you will, here at Philadelphia Baptist, it is my prayer that we all find our place in service to HIM. As long as we continue to be LED by GOD in everything we do, we will continue to be what he has called us and commissioned us to do. Make disciples, baptize and teaching them all he commanded us. All the while knowing He is with us.

I'll say it again" Get Your Popcorn Ready". With Jesus as our guide, we are in for great things. Love you all, Jenks
